• **Authors and works:** Thomas More, Utopia, “the labours of life”, the utopian vision of the Cadbury family. Brunello Cucinelli and the dream of Solomeo.

Educazione civica: The right to work .

William Shakespeare: life and works. Sonnet 18 “Shall I Compare Thee to A Summer’s Day?” Sonnet 55 “Not marbles nor gilded monuments“. A critical appreciation of a sonnet chosen by the students.

Renaissance theatre and drama: the human condition, the Globe. **Hamlet**: Plot and main themes, “To Be or Not to Be” (Act III, Scene I) **Romeo and Juliet**: Plot and main themes, The Balcony scene” (Act II, Scene II). **The Tempest**: Plot and main themes, “The Profit of Language” (Act I, Scene II). **The Merchant of Venice**: plot and main themes, vision of the film (2013).

FROM THE PURITAN TO THE AUGUSTAN AGE (1625 – 1760)

- **History lines:** England under the Tudors, The Elizabethan Age, the years after Elizabeth. Visual Arts: the Armada portrait and irreverent icons.
- **History lines:** the rise of Puritanism, Charles I's reign, the English civil war, Oliver Cromwell, the Restoration of the Monarchy, the "Glorious Revolution", order and imperial expansion in the Augustan Age, the age of Enlightenment, the spread of journalism in England and Italy.
- **Literature in context:** prose and poetry during the Puritan and the Augustean age. The rise of the novel, the circulation of news: from the coffee house to the Internet forum. The novel and the private self.
- **Educazione civica: The freedom of the press.**
- **Authors and works:** John Milton "Paradise lost", Thomas Hobbes and John Locke. Daniel Defoe: life and works *Robinson Crusoe*: plot and main themes "the means of survival", "Friday". Vision of the film Jonathan Swift: life and works *Gulliver's Travels*, plot and main themes "the building of the language". Samuel Richardson: life and works, *Clarissa*, plot and main themes, "Mysteries of the heart".
